It is flu season. Be cautious if you have a cold in the reception of communion. It is not necessary to receive from the chalice if you are a bit under the weather. When you receive communion under the form of bread or wine, you receive the fullness of the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ. Since He forever lives, receiving communion under one form always brings you the fullness of the sacrament.

There will be a **Eucharistic Adoration Mission** taking place here at St. Mary at the end of January. I'm very excited about this event! The purpose of this Mission is to introduce and encourage participation in Adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament here at St. Mary. With all that is happening at St. Mary this is a perfect time to learn more about prayer before the Blessed Sacrament. I encourage as many of you as possible to attend this Mission. Father Davidson and Father Baum of the Missionaries of the Holy Eucharist will present this Mission. You will find them and what they have to say very inspiring. There will be Mass celebrated on February 1st with the Missionaries. They will then leave us in hopes that their visit was fruitful.

*“Grand Old Saint Mary’s”
Catholic Man of the Year*

This month the Catholic Men’s Luncheon Club will select the 2017 “Catholic Man of the Year”. In 1975, Alexander “Ollie” Rueckel 90, a longtime member of Saint Mary parish was chosen “Catholic Man of the Year.” Every Sunday since 1952, when Alum Crest’s interdenominational chapel was opened, Ollie helped the institution’s bed-ridden and wheel-chair bound residents attend Sunday morning services. He brought the Catholic patients from the second and third floors down for Mass. Then, when he had returned them to their rooms, he picked up Protestant patients for morning services. Ollie, who was the oldest of ten children attended St. Mary Grade School and Rosary High School. Ollie and his wife Theresa, worked as a team in founding St. Anthony’s Guild providing equipment, beds and window drapes for depression-struck St. Anthony Hospital in Columbus. He became involved in visiting the sick and destitute through Charity Newsies, and was a member of the Holy Name Society and an original member of the St. Mary St. Vincent de Paul Society. He was affectionately known in the neighborhood as “The Mayor of Mohawk”.

Bi-Monthly Healing Mass on January 16 at Saint Joseph Cathedral:

A Mass of Healing and Healing Service will be celebrated on Monday, January 16, 6:30 p.m. at Saint Joseph Cathedral, 212 East Broad Street. Following the Mass, a Service of Healing will begin with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Veneration of relic of the True Cross of Christ, followed by an opportunity for each person to speak individually with a priest and receive a prayer of healing for what they seek; the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick will also be available. The Service of Healing will close with Benediction. All persons who seek Christ’s healing are invited – especially those who suffer with physical illness and infirmities, in addition to those who seek emotional and spiritual healing. All caregivers, family members, and members of the medical community are invited as well. Parking is available at the rear of the Cathedral accessible off East Gay Street; handicap accessible elevator is located in the courtyard (west side of the Cathedral) on East Broad Street. Bi-monthly Healing Masses take place at the Cathedral on the third Monday of the month; during the remainder of 2017 they are scheduled for: March 20, May 15, July 17, September 18, and November 20.
