Notes from the Pastor

In your charity please pray for the soul of Patrick E. D. Hammar, age 31 who died January 11th at Riverside Hospital. May he rest in peace. His dad, James, coached here at St. Mary's for many years.

Democracy lives. Once again we witness the peaceful transition of power in the United States as President Donald Trump was sworn in on Friday. Please pray for our new president and remember all the former presidents who have served our country. God bless America!

In 1973 the Supreme Court legalized abortion in our land. Human life is sacred. Please pray for the protection of the unborn; pray for those who have had abortions for healing and peace of soul. Sometimes critics say that Right-to-Lifers only care about children until they're born. Who will feed the children already born? Well, consider that the Catholic Church is against abortion, but we don't stop caring about children once they are born. Here in Columbus the two largest soup kitchens are run by the Catholic Church. The largest network of outreach to the poor are the dozens of chapters of the St. Vincent de Paul Society which often provides food, shelter, utility assistance and many other services to poor families and children. In addition, the greatest weapon against hunger and poverty is education and the Catholic Church runs the largest network of educational enterprises from kindergarten through college. The solution to hunger in our city is not more abortions. Poverty rates have increased with the availability of abortions.

Some say the church is imposing its beliefs when it teaches against abortion. Life is primarily a civil right -- just as the Church also opposes slavery and human trafficking. These are areas where human values and religious values line up perfectly.

A Thank You Note from the Far Eastside Outer belt Cat:

My name is Chino and I live on the far- east side near Reynoldsburg. I'm saddened over the news of Raphael's departure. He was a pro-life cat and saved my life, but I'm getting way ahead of my story.

It was January or February in 2011 and bitterly cold outside. Raphael was sitting in the Holy Family rectory window watching out for the neighborhood. There are a lot of homeless people around there, including four legged homeless creatures. It was Raphael who spotted my shivering mommy cat wondering around frightened, hungry, homeless and pregnant. He alerted Fr. Lutz of my mom's plight.

Fr. Lutz came out of the rectory and found my mom. He brought her over to the Holy Family Parish Center to give her a safe quiet and warm place to have her babies. On March 16, 2011 six of us were born. For two months our mother gave us milk to drink and Raphael shared his cat food with us. Thanks to Raphael, Fr. Lutz, Sheila and Donna, good homes were found for all of us.

Not all homeless stories have a happy ending, but thanks to Raphael, this one did. Seven furry felines were saved!

"Grand Old Saint Mary's"

Our Fourth Pastor - Monsignor George T. Wolz BORN July 28, 1909, ORDAINED October 28, 1934, DIED January 27, 1983....Monsignor Wolz passed away thirty-four years ago this month on January 27, 1983 at the age of 73. Father Wolz was our second pastor to be born and educated in Saint Mary parish. He graduated from Saint Mary High School at the top of his class and was class president. He was also in the first graduating class of St. Charles College-Seminary and was the Rector when the college closed in 1969. Msgr. Wolz was a brilliant scholar and achieved the highest grades at the Gregorian University in Rome of anyone who had attended that institution. His successor at Saint Mary and a former student, Father Ralph Huntzinger, described his demeanor in the classroom at St. Charles thus, "He forgot how different we were from him in our capacity for knowledge. His favorite expression was 'Good Lord, Boy!' Once he chuckled to a student. Good Lord, Boy! One thing for sure, you won't ever teach heresy—you aren't bright enough!" "He died on a Thursday as did his three predecessors at St. Mary's, the day commemorating the institution of the Sacrament of Holy Orders."
