**Notes from the Pastor**

In your charity please remember Rita Myers, mother of Vern who works at St. Ladislus. Her funeral was Saturday morning. May her good soul rest in peace.

During this time of historical research as we work on our venerable church building, some of the old bulletins yield some unexpected information. The following rules for reception of Holy Communion around 1900 were published in the bulletin by Fr. Specht:

Gentlemen:

- Do not receive your God only every six months or once a year. The first Christians received Him every day.
- You must fast from midnight on. This means from 12 o'clock sun or standard time.
- Approach the railing with folded hands, you are not going to a bar or shaving chair.
- Kneel with both knees. People will think you clumsy or tipsy if you rest one foot.
- After rising from the railing before returning bend you knee, and bend it to the floor.
- Keep your hands folded whilst walking to your pew.

Ladies

- Whilst returning do not practice a quickstep. Let your gait be modest, grave and devout.
- Ladies and gentlemen, do not forget to donate at least a quarter of an hour as thanksgiving.

Hall of Fame – Bea Thibaut

The Columbus Citizen-Journal selected Mrs. Thibaut as one of the Outstanding Women of the Year for 1961. Besides being the mother of 11 children, she was an expert seamstress, making all the clothes for her children, formal dresses for the leaders in the First Communion class, vestments for the priest and costumes and the stage curtains for the musical productions of the "Belles of St. Mary's." Mrs. Thibaut also organized the Convent Guild at St. Mary to help take care of the needs at the convent. She was an expert cook, baker, flower arranger and songwriter. Mrs. Bea Thibaut was truly one of the "Belles of St. Mary's". Bea was one of the original organizers of the "professional amateur show" known as the "Belles and Beaus of St. Mary's." Bea was the director/writer/costume designer of the productions. Originally, the shows were a fund raising vehicle for the P. T. A. These productions not only raised money for such worthy causes as furnishings for the new convent but also for repair of the church bells, church maintenance. Their popularity made them an annual event highlighting the hidden musical talents of parishioners and schoolchildren.
