## "Grand Old Saint Mary's"

Msgr. Specht on Passion Sunday - March 1903 "Why is the fifth Sunday of Lent called Passion Sunday? The reason is found in the gospel of that Sunday. "Passion" means suffering. Passion Sunday is the Sunday of Suffering. The gospel tells us how Christ tried to teach the people His Godhead-and how the Jews rose up and wished to stone Him. But Jesus hid Himself and left the temple. The fury of the Jews could leave no doubt in the mind of the Lord as to the designs of His enemies and His passion and death, which, though ten days off must have vividly passed before His mind. It is called Passion Sunday because on that day Christ began His passion by anticipation." "Why are the crosses and pictures in church covered? The crosses are covered to remind us of Jesus having hid Himself from His people." "Why are they covered with *violet* cloth? Violet being the color denoting humility and penance, the Church wishes us to humble ourselves and sympathize with our Savior in His sufferings by doing penance."

The church has been closed since then amid renovations.
