Next week is Holy Week -- The most Sacred Week of the Liturgical Year. Palm Sunday begins this beautiful week in preparation for the Resurrection of Our Lord on Easter. (The Holy Week schedule of Masses and Services is in this bulletin. Please keep it handy and participate as much as you can in each day's prayerful spirit). On Tuesday, the Chrism Mass takes place at St. Joseph Cathedral (there will be no Mass at St. Mary's, St. Lad's and Corpus Christi). Holy Thursday the Mass of the Lord's Supper will be celebrated in each church. Adoration will follow in the Chapel until midnight. This is a perfect time and place to meditate on the Institution of the Holy Eucharist and the many sufferings of Jesus for our redemption. Good Friday there is no Mass celebrated, but rather a liturgical service commemorating the death of Jesus and a Communion Service will take place. On Holy Saturday, the Easter Vigil Mass will be held at each Church. Try to immerse yourself into the sacredness of this Holy Week.

Thank you to Father Joe Tuscan who joined us for a week here at St. Mary's. His goodness and Franciscan spirit was a delight for all who met him.

On Tuesday, April 18th at 7:00 p.m. there will be a TOWN HALL MEETING regarding the progress of St. Mary's Church. It will take place in the school gym. All are welcome and encouraged to come with any questions you may have.

Patrick Madrid will be here at St. Mary's on Wednesday, April 19th in the gym. If you haven't had the pleasure of hearing him speak before, you should not miss him -- he has so much about our faith that needs to be heard.

"Grand Old Saint Mary's" Sister M. Consilia Felder BORN Oct. 6, 1901, PROFESSION Aug. 12, 1934, DIED Aug. 19, 1996 There has been a long-standing argument in the faith community concerning the importance of a parish based Catholic education to vocations. The Felder family of Saint Mary would weigh heavily on the plus side of that argument. Sister Consilia (Elizabeth) Felder was a member of the third (1920) graduating class of Saint Mary High School. Her sisters Franziska (Sister Julitta) and Clara (Sister Fulgentia) followed her into the convent. Sister Consilia, for almost fifty years, taught language and business courses at the secondary level in Catholic schools. She also worked with the less fortunate in the community. She received a citation from the Columbus Right to Life Society where she volunteered, fed the hungry as St. Vincent de Paul Food pantry Manager and visited the sick at Alum Crest Nursing Home. Sister Consilia also worked at The Ohio State University as Assistant Secretary to the Assistant Dean, and was secretary at Saint Mary Grade School. On retirement to Our Lady of Angels, Joliet, Ill. in 1991, she kept up her language skills by praying her rosary using a different language for each decade: German, French, Spanish, Latin and English.
