"Grand Old Saint Mary's" Richard Eckstein
Richard Eckstein was a member of "Grand Old Saint Mary's" who made the ultimate sacrifice for his country. This month seventy-two years ago, Lt. (JG) Richard Francis Eckstein, a fighter pilot ace in the naval air corps was assigned to the aircraft carrier USS Sangamon. On April 22, 1945, when he did not return from a mission against the Japanese in the South Pacific, he was listed as missing, and presumed dead. A Memorial Requiem Mass for Richard was held on May 11, 1945 at Saint Mary Church. Richard was the son of Florence and Edward Eckstein. His mother and three brothers Edward M., Herbert, and James Eckstein and four sisters, Mrs. Vernon L. Scriven, Mrs. Robert L. Kelley, Mrs. Peter Bureu and Mrs. Edward White, survived him. Richard was a graduate of Saint Mary High School where he had been the president of the class of 1938, Quarterback and Captain of the football team, a member of the basketball and track teams and the 155 lb. champion of the 1938 Catholic Boxing Tourney.
