"Grand Old Saint Mary's" - Fr. Specht - Nov. 4, 1840 - May 29, 1913
Father Specht, our beloved first pastor, passed away 104 years ago on May 29, 1913. In the article announcing Monsignor Specht's death *The Columbus Evening Dispatch* offered this description of him, "Beloved by Catholics and non-Catholics alike, Msgr. Specht was probably the best known member of the Catholic clergy in Ohio. Known for his extreme charity and while never a rich man, he gave freely of his income and earnings and died comparatively poor. He was a patron of St. Vincent's Orphan asylum and was a friend to all orphans." Our parish has been truly blessed to have such saintly men as our religious leaders. Requiescat in Pace, "Papa".
