"Grand Old Saint Mary's" Hunchback of Saint Mary's?

As part of the modernization of the church tower, begun by Father Burkley in the early 1940's, a ton of stone in the belfry was replaced by an electric motor weighing less than 5 pounds. The stone served as counter weight in the operating the clock. The clock was now accurate to within 8 seconds. This modernization was not without negative consequences. George Schneider, 72, lost his 50-year-old job as clock tender Monsignor Burkley said. "He now is chief oiler." Mr. Schneider, who owned and operated a watch and clock repair business would climb into the belfry each Monday morning and wind up the weights, thus assuring operation of the clock for another week. A large crank was used in the process, which required about 30 minutes. Installed in 1895 at a cost of \$3,000, the clock was of the pendulum variety and had a 5-foot pendulum. Father Burkley paid tribute to Mr. Schneider's care of the clock by stating that "never once was it necessary to make repairs." The tower was 197 feet high surmounted by a 13 foot cross and covered in gold leaf. The spire was not taller because insurance rates increased at 200 feet. (Lightning?)
