JULY 31ST CAPITAL CAMPAIGN KICKOFF

The **Save Saint Mary Church Capital Campaign** enjoyed a festive kickoff on Monday evening at the Ohio Theatre with over 1000 people in attendance for the showing of "The Bells of St. Mary's." **Father Lutz** and the **Saint Mary Choir** were joined on stage by emcee **Jym Ganahl** and Campaign Co-Chairs, **Peggy and Mike Hartshorn**. At the Kickoff Event, **Father Lutz** and the **Hartshorns** announced that early, generous Leadership gifts to the Campaign make it possible to pay off the parish's old debt plus the loan from the Diocese used to stabilize the Church when it was declared "temporarily condemned." This means that all gifts received by the Campaign from this point forward can be applied to Rebuild and Restore the Church. Today we are announcing that we have launched a Campaign Website (stmarygvcampaign.org) for all updates on the rebuilding and restoration of our Church. We have adopted a fundraising timeline that must sustain the restoration project through its entirety. In the early Fall, parishioners will receive a campaign pledge packet from a fellow parishioner serving on the **Save Saint Mary Capital Campaign** Committee.

"Grand Old Saint Mary's" First "Homecoming"

In the next week to ten days, we would normally be having our annual "Homecoming". Unfortunately, this year that is not possible. So let us look back at the first Homecoming held as part of the Golden Jubilee of the parish. The celebration ran from Saturday August 15 to Tuesday August 18, 1925. The festivities began on Saturday with a Solemn High Mass of Thanksgiving graced by the presence of the Rt. Rev. Bishop James J. Hartley, celebrating the Golden Anniversary of the Sisters of St. Francis noble labors at St. Mary's Parish. On Sunday, a street parade of the Societies preceded a Solemn Jubilee High Mass at 10:00 o'clock and Benediction. Monday morning at 9 o'clock a Solemn Requiem High Mass was held for deceased Sisters and members of St. Mary Parish. Monday evening a Grand Reunion of all members of St. Mary Parish took place on the school grounds. In the event of rain, it would be held in the Schoolrooms. All friends of St. Mary Parish were invited. Tuesday morning at 8 o'clock there was a Requiem High Mass for Fathers Specht, Wehrle & Horny by the Holy Name Society.
