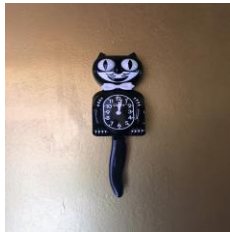

UNITED GERMAN SINGING SOCIETIES OF CENTRAL OHIO

On Oct. 1st, the United German Singing Societies of Central Ohio will present a concert at Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church in Grove City. Music will be performed by the Columbus Männerchor and Damenchor, The Mendelssohn Liedertafel, The Newark Männerchor, the Germania Gesangverein, The Columbus Swiss Singers and the Columbus Kinderchor. Music will also be provided by Alphorn Gruezie. The concert begins at 4:00 p.m. and admission is \$5.00 at the door."

"Grand Old Saint Mary's" Cruciform Medal

The story of one of our heroes from World War II, SSgt. George Eisel, son of George and Iva Eisel, brought to mind a special medal, the Cruciform medal that is a combination of a scapular, miraculous, St. Joseph and St. Christopher medals. The Rt. Rev. Monsignor Edmond A. Burkley, pastor of St. Mary had given the medal to Eisel when he was inducted into the Army in January 1942. In a nationwide front-page story, Eisel was described as "lucky" having survived a terrible crash in Iceland on May 3, 1943. The crash took the lives of Lt. Gen. Frank Andrews and 13 others. As the tail gunner on the Liberator bomber, he was the sole survivor. "He had so much faith in the protection that prayers to Our Lady, St. Joseph, the Sacred Heart, and St. Christopher gave him, that he recently wrote home asking that we try to get another medal for one boy, the only member of his crew of eight who did not wear the medal," his mother said. During his time, he was credited with shooting down two planes and putting seven out of action. He earned the Distinguished Flying Cross, two Air Medals and the Purple Heart. Information about the medal is on the back table. Pray for our men and women serving in the armed forces.
