"Grand Old Saint Mary's" - St. Francis Xavier Society

St. Mary has recently received support for the Mini-Homecoming from an entity called the 4-S Club. Old timers recognize the organization as a combination of four (now five) groups. The oldest of these groups is the St. Francis Xavier Beneficial Society formed in December 1868 by Father Specht. The Society was the first society founded at the beginning of St. Mary's Parish and was named after the Patron Saint of the Founder and First Pastor of the parish, Msgr. Francis Xavier Specht. The beneficial society was designed to provide spiritual and financial support to members in time of need. A feature of the groups was annual group attendance at Mass and support of various church activities. The early clubroom was the "Auditorium" at 581 S. High St., home to many organizations. The Society moved to its present location in the old Columbia Theater building when the Auditorium was demolished. At one time membership approached 400 men. Some of the family names bring back memories of these hard working deeply religious men, Dolder, Dunkel, Gehring, Goetz, Graff, King, Renner, Schumick, Snider, Wenger, Wurdock and many more.
