"Grand Old Saint Mary's" Catholic Order of Foresters

The Foresters are one of the societies making up the 4-S Club. The Catholic Order of Foresters is a fraternal insurance organization established in 1883 in Chicago, Illinois. As with most of these organizations they provided financial protection, in the form of insurance, for the membership. At one time these groups had huge membership rolls. For example, on January 1, 1900, over 600 children attended the old German style Christmas party, organized by the St. Mary Foresters, at the Volk's Hall, South High Street. Peter Miller was Kris Kringle and August Dimel, Chief Ranger, extended a most hearty and cordial welcome in German. The Columbus Battalion Band under the direction of Professor Max Neugebauer, (764 Mohawk Street), furnished the music for the evening. Some familiar "Grand Old St. Mary" men, August Dimel, Otto Hall, Al Schneider, John Bonner, Matthew Sieburger, Adam Kaiser, August Ruetty and Gustav Getz, organized the party. In 1940, the first Boy Ranger initiation in Columbus took place with over 300 boys participating. In 1945, Roman Kempf, Simon Kaiser, John A. Deibel and William Reeb observed the 50th anniversary of their membership in the St. Mary parish Catholic Order of Foresters.
