St. Mary's Sodality-Thousands of Easter Eggs

One of the early parish groups was the Blessed Virgin Sodality. The sixtieth Jubilee edition (1934) of the Sodality's monthly publication describes the foundation of the organization: "It was on the 15th Sunday after Pentecost on September 6, 1874 that Father Specht-God rest his soul-read the following announcement to the people of St. Mary's: 'Die jenigen welche sich die Jungfrauen Sodalitaet anschliessen wuenschen moegen sich dieser Nachmittag nach der Vesper in die Schulte versammeln.' Asking those young ladies who wished to join the Sodality to meet in the school after Vespers. The activities of the group included sewing all the priests vestments, purchasing the stained glass window depicting the Immaculate Conception and receiving Holy Communion on the Sunday closest to the patronal feast of the Immaculate Conception. Mission work, Eucharistic devotions, literary projects and religious publicity are among the groups activities. They were most proud of the fifty-one religious vocations from among the membership. One of the recurring projects of the Sodality was the collection of Easter eggs for the orphans. "Thousands of them have been collected through the years, and given joy to the unfortunate children left without their parents." In 1953, Miss Jacqueline Brush and Miss Theresa Eyerma led the annual egg collection for St. Anne's Orphanage, St. Vincent's Orphanage, the Convent of the Good Shepherd, and the Sisters of the Sick Poor
