"Grand Old Saint Mary's" Religious Sons and Daughters of the Parish

Our parish has been blessed with many sons and daughters of the parish who have entered the religious life. One of these families is the Berendt family. Monsignor Aloysius Berendt, the son of Bernard and Sophia Berendt, was born September 20, 1910 and baptized by Father Burkley. He was ordained on May 22, 1941 and stationed at Steubenville Holy Name when the Steubenville diocese was established in 1945. Msgr. Berendt was the founding pastor of Steubenville Holy Rosary parish where he remained until his retirement in 1973. He passed away April 13, 1986. His nephew, Monsignor James M. Berendt, the son of Anthony and Margaret Berendt, was born May 26, 1935 and baptized by Father Lappan. He was ordained May 28, 1955. He was associate pastor of Holy Spirit, St. Matthias, St. Francis of Assisi and St. Michaels. He was founding principal of St. Francis de Sales High School. He was pastor at Our Lady of Victory from 1972 until 1987 and Holy Cross Church until his retirement in 2000. Msgr. Berendt passed away July 2, 2002. The daughters of this incredible family include Sister Mary Berendt O.S.F., and cousins, Dominican Sister Dorita Basbagill, and Dominican Sister Bernadette Marie Basbagill.

According to the Christian tradition, angels and humans are capable of knowing and loving God. Angels do this more excellently than humans, but both do it. In the Christian tradition, angels are present not only at miraculous times, they are all around us impacting many aspects of our lives. Saint Bonaventure, a Franciscan friar from the Middle Ages, took it for granted that angels are "circling around us like flies."
