"Grand Old Saint Mary's" Criminal Record?

Yes, sadly, our beloved Pastor, like so many who grew up in the N. 4th, Hudson Street area, has a criminal record! God bless him and the other 64 pro-life supporters who were arrested demonstrating outside the Northwest Women's Center on north High Street, September 1988. In the September 18, 1988 issue of The Catholic Times, staff writer, Sharon Abercrombie provided details of the arrest. The protestors were part of Project Rescue demonstration, and Father Lutz was, at the time, the Associate Pastor of St. Pius Parish, and also did "sidewalk counseling" at local abortion clinics. When the group was arrested they were blocking the entrance to the abortion clinic. Miraculously, four young women "decided to keep their babies that day so we sent them right over to Birthright," said Father Lutz. Father refused release from jail until all of the protestors, including the out-of-towners were released. When Father recounted the experience in that Sunday's homily, "Some of the women started crying when I told them we'd saved four babies."

Omnipotent Father, place godly people in the paths of women who are considering abortion. Use these good listeners at the perfect time, in powerful ways to help women to choose life. In Jesus' name, Amen.
