"Grand Old Saint Mary's" Father Burkley – "Grand Old Man" This Friday, May 18, will mark the forty-sixth anniversary of the death of the "Grand Old Man" who coined "Grand Old Saint Mary's." The Rt. Rev. Msgr. Edmund A. Burkley, P.A., passed away one day after turning 92. The following selection from The Catholic Times in 1996 by Peggy Frank, a member of St. Mary's Youth Group preparing for a parish variety show, illustrates the effect of the sad news. "That night we were working in the gymnasium, (where we are now sitting), painting sets and practicing skits. We were planning to wish the monsignor a belated happy birthday during the show. Suddenly the church bells began ringing and ringing. They weren't tolling the time, too many. They weren't announcing Mass, too late. Something was very wrong. We had heard of father's failing health and, as if a bell went off in our collective souls, we realized why the bells were ringing. Father Burkley was dead. We climbed off our ladders, put down our paints and gathered on stage to sob and share memories of the monsignor. Someone suggested we cancel the program. Our director asked 'What would Father Burkley want?' The show would go on. We wished him a happy birthday in heaven, and I believe he was still with us in spirit." And, I believe he is still with us today in our exile in the desert. Requiescat in Pace
