VINCENT DE PAUL in sponsoring a Community Forum on Predatory Lending on Thursday, June 14, 2018 at 7:00 p.m. at St. Paul the Apostle in Westerville (Lower Level of the Church, room 3). At this forum, we will discuss the scope of the problem of payday lending in our Central Ohio communities, across the state of Ohio and our country. Many of those hurt by the payday lenders are the most vulnerable people in our community who can least afford interest rates and fees approaching 600%. During this forum we will learn about the problem of payday and car title loans in Ohio, learn about pending legislation to fix the problem of paralyzing interest rates and fees faced by our neighbors, and we will learn what we can do to make a difference. We have an excellent panel of speakers from Central Ohio who will help us understand the issue in more depth. And those who have suffered from high fees and interest rates by taking out payday loans are also invited to ask questions and share their stories.

"Grand Old Saint Mary's" Saint Mary's High School-First Graduates

This week marks a time when many of our young ones are graduating from various levels of education. Our grade school began in 1865, our high school was begun by our second pastor, Rev. Joseph M. Wehrle, (1913- 1924). Father Wehrle was a man who believed deeply in the importance of Catholic education. In 1914, Father Wehrle started Saint Mary High School in the Ohlnhausen mansion, the first building to the north of the church. The high school opened with an enrollment of thirteen pupils, five boys and eight girls, seven of whom were to graduate. Sister M. Thomasine O.S.F. was appointed as the first principal. The high school comprised a four-year classical course, which also included stenography, typing, and bookkeeping, to prepare the student, for office work if unable to complete the entire classical course. Father Wehrle encouraged and assisted the girls in seeking work in the government, and many followed his suggestion. Tuition was \$2.00 per month. The first graduates were Raymond Albert, Edward Birkenbach, Catherine Bopeley, Anna Sauer, Catherine Schwind, Helen Schwartz and Harry Thoman. Congratulations to all of our graduates this year. Pray for their success in their future endeavors.
