"Grand Old Saint Mary's" The Archives/Museum is Gone (For Now) Last Monday, June 11, saw the move of the Saint Mary's Parish Archives/Museum from the Specht Center located behind the Church, to the Jubilee Museum located at the old Holy Family school. The Archive/Museum was founded in 1999 in the west room of the Specht Center, in what was formerly the typing classroom of the old high school. The museum was founded to connect the past with the present to preserve the history of the church and the school for future generations. Father Michael B. Watson, pastor at St. Mary's, and driving force behind its foundation, in an article in The Catholic Times was quoted as saying, "This parish is rich in history. We needed to make visible our history, and that is what we are doing with the Archives Room, which has been several years in the making. We want to gather the artifacts and history of the parish so it will carry on into the future, and so the past won't die." The Archive/Museum was dedicated by Nancy Plank Kelley, a 1952 graduate of St. Mary High School and benefactress of the project, in honor of all those "faithful and true-hearted" who found a home at St. Mary and in the memory of her mother Loretta Manns Plank, an alumna and life-long parishioner. Parishioner, Bill Lenkey was instrumental in collecting, organizing and preserving materials and information, and the maintenance of a database for St. Mary alumni. The move to the Jubilee Museum was necessitated by the growth of our school, requiring the conversion of the Specht Center into regular classrooms for the upper grades. Hopefully, a planned future expansion of the school will allow the return of the Archive/Museum in a very few years. We are thankful to the Jubilee Museum for their kind offer of temporary shelter. Hopefully we will be open at the Jubilee Museum in time for this year's Homecoming. . If you have not seen the LEGO display of the Vatican at the Jubilee Museum, now is the time to go and to thank them for their kindness in our time of need.
