Notes from the Pastor

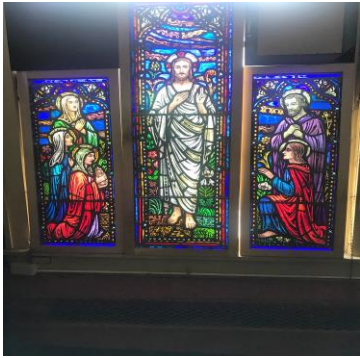

"Grand Old Saint Mary's" First "Homecoming"

It is forty days, what an appropriate number, until the annual Saint Mary's Homecoming. The forty days could represent the forty days Moses spent on Mount Sinai when we failed the test and built the golden calf, or they could represent the forty days of the flood, which would mark another time of punishment for our wickedness. I prefer to look at the forty days from a Lenten perspective, as a time of fasting and abstinence in preparation for the Homecoming. The first Homecoming celebration was actually the "Golden Jubilee" of the arrival of the Sisters of St. Francis on August 15, 1875, to teach in our grade school. Those first two Sisters were Sister Seraphina and Sister Vincent. The festivities began on Saturday August 15, with a Solemn High Mass of Thanksgiving graced by the presence of the Rt. Rev. Bishop James J. Hartley. On Sunday, a street parade of the Societies preceded a Solemn Jubilee High Mass at 10:00 o'clock and Benediction. Monday morning at 9 o'clock a Solemn Requiem High Mass was held for deceased Sisters and members of St. Mary's Parish. Monday evening a Grand Reunion of all members of St. Mary's Parish took place on the school grounds. In the event of rain, the Homecoming and Reunion would have been held in the school rooms. All friends of St. Mary's Parish were invited. Tuesday morning at 8 o'clock there was a Requiem High Mass for deceased Pastors, Fathers Specht, Father Wehrle and Father Benjamin Horny, our first regular assistant at St. Mary.
