"Grand Old Saint Mary's" Homecoming" 1930's

It is thirty-three days until the annual Saint Mary's Homecoming, August 10 and 11 at the Hey Hey 362 E. Whittier Street. In 1930, the parish had just purchased the five homes directly south of the rectory. As Father Burkley remarked, "a splendid location for the proposed New high school." That dream was never realized, but it is now the site of our wonderful grade school. Raffle books in 1930 were \$1 per book compared to \$25 dollars a book this year, (after all, it was the beginning of the Depression). The grand prizes in 1931 were **"TWO ELECTRIC REFRIGERATORS"** worth over \$200." The Grand Prize of the 2018 raffle is \$2000. The proceeds of the 1931 Homecoming went to pay for "Modern Toilet Facilities being installed in the school at a cost of \$4,500. The net proceeds that year were \$2,500. And yes, in 1931 they used outhouses. In fact, there was an outhouse at the SW corner of Frankfort and Lazelle that into the 1950's was subject to overturning on Halloween (I hear). The prizes through the Depression shrank to a top prize of \$50 in Gold. In 1933, the High School Band made its first appearance as the featured entertainment, Turtle soup and a fish fry were the main course. 3.2% beer and a "Dutch Band" rounded out the evening. The various stands included a Country Stand, Sugar Stand, Candy Stand, Chuck O Luck, Cake Stand, lunch & Eats and Ice Cream. The proceeds of the 1936 Homecoming were for the renovation of the church interior. Sound familiar? New floor, Sanctuary, Pews, Confessionals, entrances and altar rail. The food at the 1938 Homecoming was a "jitney supper." Jitney was the slang term for a nickel.
