“Grand Old Saint Mary’s” First “Homecoming” ????

It is twenty-six days until the 93rd annual Saint Mary Homecoming-Mini Fest at the Hey-Hey. Or is it? According to the July, 1940 issue of *The Columbus Register*, the Diocese of Columbus newspaper at the time, the 1940 festival was the 75th. That would mean that the first “Homecoming” was in 1865. How can you have a “Homecoming” if your home has not yet been built? St. Mary Church was dedicated in 1868.

The *Catholic Telegraph*, the Diocese of Cincinnati newspaper, may hold the answer to this puzzle. An article in the January 1866 edition describes an event that took place in Columbus in December 1865 thusly. “As to the zealous Germans, the old church (Holy Cross) proving unsuited to their wants, they erected, during the year 1865, on south Third Street, an entirely new and creditable school (St. Mary’s). To pay off the debts contracted by both the recent improvements, fairs were recently held. St. Mary’s School Fair opened December 11, and closed on the 20th, netting as I am told, \$3,200. St. Mary’s contains over 400 pupils, who are taught by two accomplished Sisters of Notre Dame.” 400 students in four rooms, with two nuns and two lay teachers would spell chaos today. This school building is the present Specht Center, which is currently undergoing renovations to accommodate the top four grades of the grade school as our school continues to grow. The proceeds from our current “Homecoming” will aid in the renovation. The coincidence is amazing, and the need is just as great. So support your parish and sell as many tickets as you can. We should at least beat the 1865 total of \$3,200. And, if the 1865 Fair was the first “Homecoming”, the Hey Hey Mini Fest, August 10 & 11, 2018 would be the 153rd? (Please check my math Sister Eudora.)

BI-MONTHLY MASS OF HEALING JULY 16, 6:30 p.m. at SAINT JOSEPH CATHEDRAL will be celebrated on the Memorial of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. Following the Mass, the Healing Service will begin with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and Veneration of relics of the True Cross. Each person then will then have an opportunity to speak individually with one of several priests present to discuss their particular situation and receive a prayer of healing; the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick will also be available. The Healing Service will conclude with Benediction. All persons who seek Christ’s healing are invited – especially those who suffer with physical illness and infirmities (e.g. cancer and other debilitating diseases and conditions), in addition to those who seek emotional and spiritual healing. All caregivers, family members, and members of the medical community are invited as well. Bi-monthly Healing Masses take place at the Cathedral on the third Monday of the month; during the remainder of 2018 Masses are scheduled for: September 17, and November 19. Secured parking is available off East Gay Street; handicap elevator access to the Cathedral is located off the Broad Street Courtyard.
