"Grand Old Saint Mary's" "Homecoming"-1940's

Nineteen days until the 93rd annual Saint Mary's Homecoming-Mini Fest at the Hey Hey/4-S Club. Last week we saw that a fundraiser in 1865 for the construction of St. Mary's School, the first Parish building, brought in \$3,200. We garnered over \$8,000 at last year's Mini-Fest. The 1940 Homecoming was actually held in commemoration of the 75th anniversary of the first school building (Specht Center), the contract for which was signed on St. Patrick's Day and completed in August 1865. A Solemn High Mass was celebrated in the church, August 15, 1940 by the Rt. Rev. Monsignor Edmund A. Burkley, pastor, assisted by Rev. L. J. Dury and the Rev. Mr. Aloysius Berendt. A Google search revealed that the \$3,200, (the 1865 total) would be the equivalent of \$46,600 in 2018 dollars, so we have a long way to go. (Extra raffle tickets are available on the back table!!!!). The 4-S Club, one of the Mini-Fest venues, has been involved in the St. Mary's Homecoming festival from the beginning. The original 4-S Club was located in the "Auditorium" at 581 South High Street. The 4-S Club began as a combination of the Knights of St. John, St. Paul's Beneficial Society, the Catholic Order of Foresters and the St. Francis Xavier Society. The name should probably be called the 5-S Club since the recent addition of the Knights of Columbus to the group. In the past, each of the societies was in charge of a stand. For example, in the 1940's, the Holy Name Society under the direction of John Neumeier, was in charge of the Country Stand, the Knights of St. John led by Ferdinand (Ferdy) Thomas ran the Sugar Stand, St. X and St. Paul ran the Ham Stand. An Ox roast, hosted by the women of the Altar Society, was a popular dinner offering at the time with the High School band providing the entertainment. The 1940 Homecoming funded the repair of the church organ while the proceeds from 1941 furnished a new GAS furnace for the convent. Father Burkley remarked at the time, "You would be shocked if we told you what that will cost because we were horrified!" (For the younger generation, coal was the heating fuel of the day.) Also, remember, the Great Depression was still a major economic problem.
