**CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE**

We have great news to report – and more details will be included in a full page bulletin insert next week, the first weekend in August. The “bottom line” is that **we have now raised \$5.3 M**, 71% of our new, expanded goal of \$7.5 M, thanks be to God! This is also thanks to YOU, who have been continuing with your gifts and pledges, and thanks to some of the new “community” donors who are stepping in to help us rebuild our parish, including our wonderful school. Plus, work on Specht Center has NOT slowed down work on our Church one bit – you will notice that stained glass windows are being removed and restored one by one (at Franklin Art Glass) and work is currently focused on the outside of the building. All parishioner gifts to the Church restoration (Phase I of our project) are being used for that purpose and we will meet our deadline of opening the Church for Easter 2019 -- as long as parishioners CONTINUE with your gifts and pledges! **"Grand Old Saint Mary's" "Homecoming"-1950's**

Twelve days until the 93<sup>rd</sup> annual Saint Mary's Homecoming-Mini Fest at the Hey Hey/4-S Club. The decade of the 40's saw some major changes in the annual festival. The pre-World War II period was still in the clutches of the Great Depression. The "Grand Prize" was \$50 in 1942, and the festival was traditionally held for one day during the week, usually on a Tuesday. It was not until after WWII that employment and the improved economy saw a change to what we see today. 1947 was the last Tuesday festival. The Grand Prize in 1947 was a Plymouth 2 Dr. De Luxe Sedan. Starting in 1948 the festival became the Friday/Saturday affair it is today. In 1948 a Buick Super Eight 4 Dr. Sedan was the "Grand Prize. The 1950's marked some significant historical events. The 1950 festival celebrated the 75 years of "fruitful service of the Sisters of St. Francis from Joliet, Illinois, here at St. Mary's," and the introduction of something referred to in the August 20 Bulletin as "Sloppy Joe sandwiches, (whatever that is?)" 1951 saw the loss to the parish of Father James W. Kulp, his replacement was Father Patterson. The 1952 festival payed for tower and cross repairs and the movement of the Communion to a lower step to accommodate the elderly. In 1952, City gambling laws banned "all raffles, wheels etc. The 1954 fest not only had a new Olds as the Grand Prize, but the seller of the winning ticket received a new Chevy. 1955 marked the fiftieth anniversary of the ordination to the priesthood of Father Burkley, and the laying of the cornerstone of the "new" Grade School building. The proceeds of the festival went to the construction of the school. Proceeds in 1956 went toward the purchase of 200 school desks, in TWO colors! The 1958 festival featured 27 stands including a "Dunk the Clown" booth with Father Frank Schaefer as the featured dunker! Hmmm, Father Lutz? 1958 also saw a move from Friday/Saturday to Saturday/Sunday. Goodbye Friday Fish dinner, hello Sunday Fried Chicken! Next week – faithful volunteers.
