*"Grand Old Saint Mary's" – Rules for a New School Year*

School began Wednesday and numerous violations of the rules were observed! Therefore a list of "Rules for St. Mary's School, Columbus, Ohio" is provided for the guidance of parents and especially permissive grandparents. "1. It is the sacred duty of Catholic parents to send their children to a Catholic school. Godless education is a scourge to the Child and to the commonwealth. 2. The scholastic year opens with a High-Mass. 3. Children should come to school on the first day. 4. Children must attend school *punctually* and *regularly*. 5. Parents are requested not to keep children at home except in case of grave necessity. 6. A card of inquiry will be sent after an absence of two days. 7. Children with frequent absences will be turned over to the truant officer. 8. Children must give satisfactory proofs of diligence and progress to be promoted. 9. Children on the way to and from school are forbidden to throw stones, fight, or use vile language. 10. Parents should look to neatness and cleanliness in the dress of their children. 11. Parents are bound in justice and charity to keep their children at home with a contagious disease. 12. Stubborn students will be punished, incorrigible children will be dismissed. 13. No child is permitted to go "up street" or home without permission. 14. Admittance to school-rooms is denied to all advertisers. 15. Parents are warned against believing every complaint of children against teachers. 16. All complaints to teachers and priests should be made in the proper place, time and spirit. 17. All reasonable complaints lodged in a spirit of charity will receive due consideration. 18. Promotion qualification is the purview of teachers, not the opinions of parents or guardians. 19. No child will be admitted to the Communion class who has not proven virtue and knowledge. 20. Children wishing to receive first Holy Communion must study all year long. 21. There will be monthly report cards. 22. Tuition for pupils of lower grades is 25 cents per month, for all others 50 cents per month. *Der St. Marien Kinderfreund, August 1903.* Holy Mary, Pray for us.
