"Grand Old Saint Mary's" Sister Mary Duffy

Sister Mary Louise Duffy was one of five Columbus girls who took part in the reception and profession ceremonies of the Order of St. Francis' convent, Joliet, Illinois, August 12, 1946. Sister Mary was one of four who received the white veil and entered the novitiate for a two-year period. Her sister, Margaret, Sister Jean Marie, who had completed her novitiate, took the black veil of the order and made her first profession of vows. The other three girls, also St. Mary graduates, were Dorothy Schlieb, Adrian Goldson and Elaine Schneider. Sister Mary Karen, also a St. Mary's graduate, received the black veil and made her profession. Monsignor Edmund Burkley, pastor of St. Mary's parish, was present for the services. Sister Mary always had an interest in political ministry. Her interest in government was part of her classroom teaching, as was her participation in "Network" a religious lobby group of priests, Brothers and Sisters, for social justice. She worked for just laws on the national level, in the 95th Congress, mainly in the areas of employment, food policy and arms proliferation. Sister Mary was an accountant for the Auditor of State. She was also St. Mary's parish council secretary, a member of the League of Women Voters, and president of Diocesan St. Vincent de Paul Society. She was the first woman to serve as president of the Columbus Particular Council, a federation of St. Vincent de Paul conferences. Whenever she saw an injustice done, or a person oppressed, she would step up and become an advocate. She was known by many as "The Public Defender." She passed away June of 1993. Pray for vocations. *Mother most pure, pray for us.*
