Notes from the Pastor

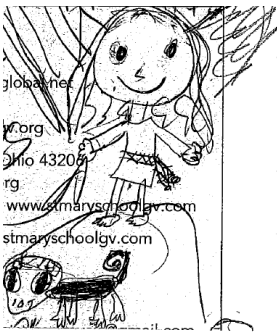

"Grand Old Saint Mary's"

One of Our Beloved Assistant Priests – Father Richard F. Engle

Father Engle was Assistant pastor at St. Mary's from 1961 to 1965. Father Engle grew up in St. Patrick parish and was a World War II veteran. He served in the U.S. Army and at the Battle of Normandy received the Purple Heart! He graduated from Ohio State University and studied for the priesthood at St. Mary Seminary, Cincinnati. Father Engle was ordained by Bishop Ready on May 26, 1956. He started his priestly career as Assistant at Portsmouth Holy Redeemer, St. Mary, St. Christopher and St. John the Evangelist. In 1968, Father Engle was appointed pastor of Dresden St. Ann. He served as pastor at St. Phillip the Apostle and Dennison Immaculate Conception. He taught at St. Mary, Bishop Hartley and Bishop Ready High Schools. Father Engle gained national attention when as pastor at St. Phillip the Apostle he began a program of gun collection in the parish, which spread nationally. The guns collected were melted down into crosses. In 1978, Bishop Herrmann presented one of the crosses to Pope Paul VI. Pray for vocations. Mother most chaste, Pray for us.

God, Spoil Me with Your Love

My favorite saint is Thérèse of Lisieux, "The Little Flower" (the saint from whom Mother Teresa took her religious name). I have been friends with the Little Flower since the fourth grade. Her way of talking about the faith and her understanding of God resonated with my own experience of faith formed so well by my mother. For St. Thérèse, God was not mean, angry, and ready to cast us all into hell. God was a font and source of love. He was not expecting us to prove our love to him because his Son had proved his love for us on the cross. At a young age, I learned from St. Thérèse that the one thing God expected most from me was to let him love me.
