*"Grand Old Saint Mary's"* Father George F. Drescher  
Father Drescher joined Father Lappan as an assistant pastor to St. Mary's in May 31, 1925. Father Drescher was born August 5, 1899 in Wilkensburg, Pa. He studied at the Josephinum and was ordained May 21, 1925 in St. Joseph's Cathedral by Bishop James J. Hartley. Father Drescher served St. Mary's not only as our beloved assistant pastor, but also endeared himself as the Athletic Director of St. Mary's High School sports. One of the students wrote this about Father Drescher in the school newspaper. "The spirit shown by Father Drescher has been in a large way responsible for the splendid showing of St. Mary teams. Every student appreciates what Father is doing and pledges his support in whatever he may undertake." In 1934, he was assigned as pastor of Miltonsburg St. John's church where he served until 1945 when he was named pastor of Cambridge St. Benedict's. Father Drescher passed away March 7, 1951 and was buried from Cambridge St. Benedict's. + Requiescat in Pace. Pray for vocations. Mother inviolate, Pray for us.
