Thank you to all of you who worked on making the Spaghetti Dinner an enjoyable and successful family event for the school. Also, thank you to all those who supported it by your participation.

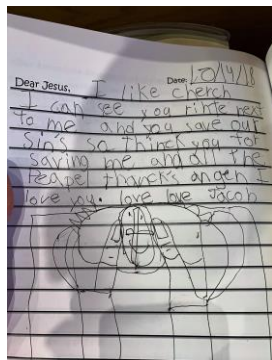

"This worship called forth by God, Adoration is different from other acts of worship, such as supplication, confession of sin, etc., inasmuch as it formally consists in self-abasement before the Infinite, and in devout recognition of His transcendent excellence."

**FATHER LUTZ-40<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY OF ORDINATION TO THE PRIESTHOOD**

On November 11<sup>th</sup> Father Lutz will celebrate his 40<sup>th</sup> Ordination anniversary to the Priesthood. Following each Mass that weekend there will be a time for refreshments and a time to congratulate and thank Father for his years of dedicated service to the Holy Catholic Church and to the countless people whose lives he has touched. *"Grand Old Saint Mary's"* Father Francis X. Schweitzer

Father Schweitzer was an assistant pastor at St. Mary's for two years, 1953 to 1955. However, in reality, you could say that he is still with us today in the person of Father Lutz. First, let us start at the beginning. Father Schweitzer was born in 1920, the son of a railroad worker in Delaware, Ohio. His mother died when he was eight and his father raised him and his seven brothers and sisters. Father Schweitzer attended Delaware St. Mary's Grade School, St. Charles High School and, in 1942, received his B. A. from St. Charles College. He attended Mt. St. Mary's Seminary in Cincinnati, graduating in 1945. Bishop Ready ordained Father Schweitzer, October 27, 1945. He served as assistant at Zanesville, St. Nicholas and Corpus Christi before coming to St. Mary's in 1953. He was well loved and respected by all at St. Mary's especially by the altar boys who conferred on him the special designation "The Black Knight" for his full head of black hair and the way his black cape billowed behind him as he hustled up the sacristy door so he would not be late for the 5am Mass. After leaving St. Mary's in 1955 to become pastor of Our Lady of Lourdes in Ada, Ohio. He then spent a year ministering to Spanish-speaking in Brownsville, Texas, served as pastor of Newark, Blessed Sacrament, taught at Bishop Hartley High School, and was Chaplain at Ohio Northern University where he received the honorary degree of Doctor of Public Service. In 1973, he became pastor of Holy Family Church where he served until his retirement in 1997. It is during his service at Holy Family that he became known for his work with the poor and homeless. On his assignment to Holy Family, he was instructed by the Chancery to "Go to Holy Family and either close it or turn it into a mission." Instead, Father created an army of volunteers and brought it back to life. Father Schweitzer was instrumental in establishing the Holy Family Soup Kitchen. In his funeral homily for Father Schweitzer, October 28, 2013, Father Lutz described some of the special actions of Father Schweitzer, beginning with the selection of Father Lutz as his replacement. "In 1997 Father had asked for permission to retire and Bishop Griffin inquired if he had any suggestion for a replacement. Schweitzer often repeated that the Holy Spirit prompted him to say *Father Lutz!* He later told me that even though he didn't know me, he was sure God had spoken to him. Each day in the soup kitchen, Father led the prayers, served the food and offered friendly counsels." "After Mass, Father went to the backyard to his stone table where he held court with his large-print Bible, teapot, cash box and a long line of the poor banished children of Eve. Each took a seat and poured out a story... his expression always showed compassion and concern. Every soul felt like they were finally being listened to." Requiescat in Pace. Pray for vocations. Mother Unfiled, Pray for us.
