*"Grand Old Saint Mary - Rev. Bernard Hillebrand  
Our First Assistant Pastor?"*

No, our first "assigned" Assistant Pastor was Father Benjamin P. Horny who met a tragic death in 1903. However, Father Hillebrand did have strange connections with both St. Mary's and Father Horny. Starting at the beginning, Father Hillebrand was born in Brilon, Westphalia, Germany, on January 21, 1834. He immigrated to America in 1864 and completed his studies at Mt. St. Mary's Seminary in Cincinnati. On Wednesday May 13, 1866, there was a solemn Pontifical Mass sung by the Most Reverend Archbishop Purcell in Holy Cross Church where 108 persons were confirmed and Mr. Bernard Hillebrand received Tonsure and four minor orders. Rev. Hemsteger, Pastor of Holy Cross, assisted Bishop Purcell. Father Specht, recently appointed Pastor of St. Mary's performed the duties of Deacon of Honor. "In the afternoon, the Society of the congregation of Holy Cross went in procession with banners, music, flags and regalia, one mile to the site of the proposed new church (our St. Mary's), where the corner stone was blessed by the Most Rev. Archbishop..." This is also the time when the name of the church "Mary, the Mother of God" was first revealed. On the next three days Mr. Hillebrand was ordained Sub-deacon, Deacon and on Wednesday, Priest. As to his first assignment, "He is in feeble health. He is expected to live and do duty only in the Franciscan Sisters Hospital (on the present site of Grant Hospital) and offer occasional Holy Sacrifices in the parish churches (St. Mary's). While at St. Francis Hospital Father Hillebrand, "occasionally" baptized, married, buried and heard the Confession of many St. Mary's parishioners. Among these are members of the Eisel, Baumbusch, Koenig, Saile, Hellenthal, Gottlieb, and many other families. At the end of 1875, Father Hillebrand left Columbus for the Diocese of Covington, Kentucky, where he worked until his death in 1917. In those years, he served as chaplain of St. John Orphanage, becoming known as the "Orphan Father" for his great work in this field. Oh, his connection with Father Horny, their service overlapped at St. Mary's and Father Horny passed away from his accident in 1903 at St. Francis Hospital. Requiescat in Pace. Pray for vocations. Mother most amiable, Pray for us.
