"Grand Old Saint Mary's" Some of Our Veterans
November 11 is Veteran's Day, the day when we remember and honor those who gave so much to keep us safe. This week and next week the bulletin will contain vignettes of those who served their country. This is an alphabetical listing with no attempt to rank or otherwise grade the quality of service. They all served their country honorably. The list will continue next week.

**Private First Class Bernard H. Butler*, US Army Infantry. Awarded a second Purple Heart and the Combat Infantryman's Badge for wounds suffered in France and he participated in a number of battles in Italy that resulted in the capture of several enemy positions. He became a prisoner of war October 30, 1945. Bernard was a student at St. Mary class of 1943.

**Margaret M. Dauer*, Chief Petty Officer, USN. Margaret enlisted in the WAVES and in 1944 was serving with Naval Medical Bureau in Washington, DC. Margaret was a member of Saint Mary High School class of 1937.

**T/Sgt. Martin William Deibel*, USA Air Corp, was home on a 60-day furlough after liberation from a Nazi prison camp. A graduate of Aquinas high school, he was serving as a radio gunner on a B-24 Liberator bomber, when captured in 1944 in Italy.

**SSgt. Donald Dimel*, USA Air Corps. A charter member of the "I Bombed Japan Club" was reported missing in action in August, 1943. He was a former student of St. Mary class of '41.

**Richard J. Egger*, USA, Saint Mary class of 1936. During World War II he was stationed at the Ballistic Research Laboratories, Aberdeen Proving Grounds in Maryland. Egger performed critical work in radar. In addition, as a scientist and pioneer in the U.S. Space Program much of his work involved firing missiles at White Sands Missile Range in New Mexico and at Cocoa Beach (now Cape Canaveral) in Florida. He worked with the German rocket scientists who came to the U.S. after the war.

**SSgt. Thomas J. Federer* USA, Saint Mary class of '47. A member of the 101st Airborne in Korea, he received the Purple Heart, the Korean Service Medal, and 2 Bronze Stars. Federer was wounded four times in Korea.

**T/Sgt. William O. Fischer* served in WWI. He was a graduate of St. Mary's grade and high school; he had been previously reported missing in action was officially proclaimed KIA. The message from the War Department disclosed that he was shot down during a mission over Berlin in April 1944, by anti-aircraft fire while in a plane carrying a full bomb load. Six of the ten crew members were saved. In a letter written to his parents shortly before his death he said that he had flown 10 missions.
