As of this Sunday, it will be 91 days until Palm Sunday. This week the workers were taking up the wood floor in the church in preparation for the new floor. In my frequent visits to check progress, they are presently working on the High Altar. It is being cleaned and freshened up, thus making it even more beautiful. The angels on the wall in the sanctuary are also being cleaned and touched up. The final addition of wall borders and the installation of windows is taking place. Soon enough the sidewalk out front of the church will no longer be an obstacle course resembling the moon with its many craters. A beautiful pattern of brick and cement will give a lovely appearance to the entrance of St. Mary's, so you can "Trip the Light Fantastic" instead of just tripping.

The students are looking forward to getting back into the church-- especially the Second Graders who will make their First Communion and the Eighth Graders who will graduate from there.

HIGH SCHOOL NOTEWORTHY NEWS

- **ST. CHARLES** will offer its annual Scholarship Test to prospective students at 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. on Saturday, January 26, 2019 in the school's Robert C. Walter Student Commons. The test results are used to help determine who will receive merit-based scholarships and grants offered by the school to its students in the 2019-2020 school year. For the 2018-2019 school year alone, St. Charles is providing more \$400,000 in academic scholarships and over \$1.4 million in tuition assistance to its students. The test is open to all 8th grade boys who are currently enrolled at any of the public, parochial, and private elementary or middle schools in Franklin or the other surrounding counties that comprise Central Ohio. Anyone interested in sitting for the St. Charles scholarship test must register by calling Laurie Berndt in the school office at 614-252-6714 between 8:30 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. Monday through Friday.
