Each person will discover God in a unique way—an experience of beauty, love, forgiveness, generous sacrifice—the smile of a child, the first glimpse of the Grand Canyon, a donated organ, betrayal, persecution. **"Grand Old Saint Mary's" The 1987 Renovation**

On May 12, Saint Mary will experience the second rededication ceremony since its establishment in 1865. The Most Reverend James A. Griffin, Bishop of Columbus, rededicated Saint Mary December 6, 1987. The rededication followed a seven-year renovation process that began in 1980 when our pastor, Msgr. Wolz, initiated the series of renovation projects. These projects included a new bell control system, the lining of the roof gutters, steeple cleaning and renovation, lightning rods added, chimneys pointed, interior and exterior lights installed and the church exterior siliconed. In 1983, to further the work a liturgical direction renovation committee was formed. A number of members of the parish were not happy with the committee, which they said included outsiders appointed by the Bishop and newcomers who were not invested in St. Mary traditions. The renovation of the interior was based on the need to move away from the Roman form of the liturgy. This view can be understood from a quote from one of the reference materials used by the renovation committee. "If the building could talk it would say 'I am not a museum where people can come and look at my beautiful artifacts; I am a house for God's people who worship in common. Nothing in me should be in competition with that central community ACTION.'" Among the suggested actions, were the whitewashing of the walls, including the trim around the windows, removing the large crucifix over the altar, completely removing the side altars, replacing the too garish Stations of the Cross, removing the confessionals to be replaced with reconciliation rooms in the rear of the church removing the communion rail and unneeded benches. Most, but not all, of these changes were made. Another source described the purpose of the renovation "The goal in searching for solutions to the renovation of St. Mary's Church has been to create an environment which allows the spirit, action and perception of liturgy to exist freely and unencumbered by extraneous visual stimuli." Because of the restoration, the Church was the fifth recipient of the "James B. Recchie Design Award". The award, given by the Columbus Landmarks Foundation "to honor excellence in Columbus Urban design," was presented May 10, 1988 at the Cultural Arts Center to Father Ralph Huntzinger, St. Mary's pastor, and to the renovation's architects.

*A little side note: Father Lutz will be honored with the Caretakers of a Legacy President's Award for the outstanding restoration of Saint Mary.*
