"Grand Old Saint Mary's" Parish Veterans Remembrance

I am writing this column on the eve of the 75th Anniversary of D-Day. It seems appropriate to continue the list of our Saint Mary heroes: The Kaepfner Family: in 1945 the four sons of George Kaepfner held a reunion in Hannau, Germany. They were Sgt. George of the 3rd Army Tank Corps, Sgt. Andrew of the 7th Army Tank Corps, Pfc. Alois or the 15th Army Quartermaster Corps and Cpl. Albert Kaepfner of the 9th Air Force. All graduates of St. Mary High School.

Platoon Sgt. Karl Kellermeyer served in the 35th Division, L Company, 320 Infantry in the European-Middle Eastern Theater. He received 2 Purple Hearts w/Oak leaf cluster.

The Krebs Brothers: The Krebs boys were 19 year old twins, James and John(Jack), serving in the same unit near St. Vith in Belgium when Jack was struck by a bullet from a German sniper. They started the Act of Contrition together, but Jack never finished it.

Three former members of the St. Francis Xavier society who lost their lives in the armed service in World War II were honored with the celebration of a memorial Mass at 9:00 Sunday, Dec. 8, 1946 in St. Mary Church. The former service men whose memory was honored are Lt. (j.g.) Richard Eckstein, Pfc. Norman Leitwein, and Lt. Donald Meyers. The 265 members of the society gathered in the schoolyard at 8:45 a.m., where members of St. Mary Holy Name society joined them. Knights of St. John of the uniform rank led the group into church, and four ex-service men, wearing the uniforms of the Army and Navy, were Mass servers.

Cpt. Henry Meldragon, in recognition of his heroic action during the Battle of the Bulge, was awarded His Majesty's Military Cross. Cpt. Meldragon had also been awarded the Silver Star, the Purple Heart w/ two clusters, two Croix de Guerre, the Presidential Unit Citation, four Bronze Battle Stars, and the Combat Infantryman's Badge. He spent two years in the hospital recovering from wounds incurred in action.

Lt. Arthur W. Miller participated in action in Sicily where his unit was mistakenly dropped behind a British beachhead and captured a town of 20,000. In July 1944 he was preparing to take part in the Normandy Invasion.

James Morbitzer, Medic, was with the 10th Mountain Division in the mountains of Italy where he was cited for bravery for evacuating wounded soldiers under enemy fire.

William C. Neymeyer was killed in action, July 12, 1944.

Cpl. Bernard Prehm was wounded, June 23, 1944 on Saipan.

Louis G. Ruscilli U. S. Army Air Corps, a gunner on a B-24 Liberator, received the Purple Heart after being shot down over Yugoslavia.
